I therefore believe it is my duty to my country to love it; to support its Constitution; to obey its Laws; to respect its Flag; and to defend it against all it's enemies.

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

Sam Magtanong is a Filipino-American entrepreneur, business-owner, Army veteran, philanthropist, husband to his childhood sweetheart of over 21 years and father of 5 children.

Sam was born in the Philippines and immigrated to the United States when he was four years old, growing up locally in Carmel Mountain Ranch and graduating from Rancho Bernardo High School in 1999. Sam is the son of a non-denominational pastor and was raised with a strong sense of service to country and community by grateful immigrant

parents. He graduated from the University of Southern California in Los Angeles with a degree in History and commissioned as an Army Infantry 2nd Lieutenant through the University's Army Reserve Officer Training Program. Sam served with the 1st Battalion, 12th Infantry Regiment and the 2nd Squadron, 9th Cavalry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division and was stationed in Fort Carson, Colorado. In 2005, he deployed with his unit in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom 05-07 and assigned to Task Force Band of Brothers, 3rd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division, to support combat operations in Diyala Province, Iraq. Sam's awards for war-time service include the Combat Infantryman's Badge and Bronze Star Medal. He left active-duty service in 2007, earning the rank of Captain, and continued with service in the active reserve component until 2013.

After active-duty service and compelled to continue to serve his community, Sam transitioned to a career in the long-term and post-acute healthcare industry, becoming a licensed nursing home administrator and vice-president of operations leading teams dedicated to dignify care for the most vulnerable and fragile of the population, our seniors. In 2013, Sam and his wife, Beverly, along with two friends, founded Mostra Coffee, a specialty coffee roaster, in the Magtanong family garage. Driven by the mission to help eradicate poverty in the Philippines by creating sustainable livelihoods for hundreds of small share-holder farmers and their families across the Philippine Islands through direct-trade relationships, Mostra Coffee champions Philippine Specialty Coffee, is the largest purchaser of coffee from the Philippines in the United States, and is the recipient of the international and coveted 2020 Micro Roaster of the Year award by ROAST Magazine. His business has been featured on Forbes, Us Weekly, Buzzfeed, Gear Patrol, Huffington Post, Conde Nast's Bon Appétit, ABC, NBC, FOX, KTLA, CBS, MSN, ABS-CBN, TFC, Alaska Airlines, Google Talks at Google HQ, and was also the recipient of Qualcomm's small business technology accelerator grant program as well as the San Diego Union-Tribune Community Heroes Award. In 2020, Sam transitioned out of the healthcare industry after 12 years of service to focus full-time in supporting Mostra Coffee's growth.

Sam and Beverly, along with their five children, ages 14, 9, 5, 4, and 20 months, live in the community of 4S Ranch, just a few miles away from where they both grew up. Sam is passionate about giving back to local and global communities and in helping Leaders increase their positive impact to their families, organizations and society and experience more happiness and success through authentic, intuitive, empathic, and inspirational leadership.
