

Colonel Carl F. Huenefeld was born in Arkansas, raised in Massachusetts, and enlisted in the Marine Corps in June of 1971, graduating from Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, SC, and Infantry Training Regiment at Camp Lejeune, NC. He initially served as an Artillery Fire Controlman, deploying off the coast of Vietnam with Battalion Landing Team, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines. Returning to the United States in 1973, his early career included the following tours of duty: 10th Marines; Sergeant of the Guard at Naval Prison Portsmouth, NH; the Marine Security Guard Detachment in

Karachi, Pakistan, with a follow-on assignment in Canberra, Australia; First Field Artillery Group, Twentynine Palms, CA; and, Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, CA. He completed a Baccalaureate Degree during his off-duty time and in 1980, while serving as a staff noncommissioned officer, he was competitively selected for Officer training – commissioned in August 1980.

As a commissioned officer, then Lieutenant Huenefeld completed the Basic Artillery Officer Course and follow-on Nuclear Weapons Assembly Officer training at Fort Sill, OK. His command tours include: Headquarters Battery, 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines; Battery F, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; 11th Marines Regimental Headquarters Battery, which he led though the Gulf War and the liberation of Kuwait; Marine Corps Recruiting Station, San Diego, CA; Battalion Inspector/Instructor for 1st Battalion, 14th Marines at Alameda, CA; and, 8th Marine Corps District.

Key staff and leadership tours include: I Marine Expeditionary Force, G-7, Fire Support Officer; I Marine Expeditionary Force, Fires Coordinator; Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego Inspector, and, Headquarters & Service Battalion Executive Officer; the III Marine Expeditionary Force, Force Fires Coordinator and the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3; and, Chief of Staff for Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego. He is a graduate of the Marine Corps Command and Staff College in Quantico, VA, and the National War College in Washington, D.C.

Colonel Huenefeld formally retired from the United States Marine Corps on 31 June 2011 with 40 years and 1 day of active duty. Afterward, he served ten years as a civilian employee of the Department of Defense, serving as the Community Liaison for the Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego. He currently serves in leadership positions with nonprofits and civic groups in San Diego, California, to include being President of the Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego Museum Foundation.

Colonel Huenefeld is married to the former Judith Ann Lohse of Blue Island, IL, and they have three married children, Brett, Kristen, and John (a Marine Corps Field Grade Officer) and six grandchildren.
